

Learning Centre Students:

We offer **Primary** and **Non-Primary** registration in Grade 10-12 courses.

What is the difference between **Primary** and **Non-primary**?

Primary students are students who are registered with a Sturgeon School Division High School for their programming in a school year.

Non-Primary student registrations refer to high school students who are registered with a school in another authority (other than Sturgeon Public School Division) and would like to take courses (up to 6 credits) with the Learning Centres.

*Please note that Non-Primary students applying to the Learning Centres **must have a primary school enrollment** (the student had to have been enrolled in another Alberta high school **by September 30** of the current school year) in order for us to accept the registration.*

Course Credit Limit for Non-Primary Students: Non-Primary students may take a *maximum of 6 credits* during the regular school year with the Learning Centres.

- **Students can expect to work at least eight hours per week** to complete a 5-credit course.
- **Non-Primary students requesting a 5-credit course with the Learning Centres** may require approval from our Counsellor if they are taking a full course load at their primary school.

NEW Primary and Non-Primary students must complete a 1-credit introductory course called *E-Learning and Learning Management Systems (COM1255)*.
