All coursework for both SPVA and the Learning Centres, should be submitted by June 15, 2023 to allow time for final exams prior to the end of June. Students learn best when they submit assignments regularly and on time so they can receive feedback on their work and can then apply it to future assignments. Submitting assignments in one large bundle does not lead to the best learning experience for students.




## Math with Mr. Kaya!

In March, grade 5 and 6 students completed the Angles and Polygons unit.

Students learned:

- Relate improper fractions to mixed numbers
- · Identify proper, improper, and mixed fractions
- Demonstrate an understanding of ratio concretely, pictorially, and symbolically
- Demonstrate an understanding of percent (limited to whole numbers) concretely, pictorially, and symbolically.
- Explore equivalent ratios
- Relate percents to fractions and decimals



IIn March, grade 7 students completed the Operations with Fractions unit.

Grade 7 Students learned to add and subtract fractions using models, pictures, and symbols. They also learned to add and subtract mixed fractions. Students solved a variety of problems involving the addition and subtraction of fractions.


#### Math 8 :


Grade 8 are finishing their work on Tessellations and Transformations with an awesome Tessellation Art Project

Grade 9 are finishing up their work on adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing polynomials

Science 6: We are completing our Unit on Flight and then moving on to Air and Aerodynamics.

Science 7: We are wrapping up our unit on Structures and Forces. We will be starting our final unit, Planet Earth.

Science 8: We completed the Mechanical Systems unit and are starting our final unit, Fresh and Saltwater Systems.


Health 5-7 : We are continuing our Financial Literacy Unit.

# CYBERWORLD: WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOUTH PRESS SEND?

In this presentation from the Saffron Centre, parents and caregivers will be provided with information about online safety. This night is designed for adults, and not suitable for children. Topics will be of mature content and include popular websites, games, and apps that are being used by children and youth such as TikTok, Instagram, and Snapchat. Included in the presentation will be the discussion around pornography, sexting, and sexual exploitation. Legal consequences will be discussed as well as how to approach these conversations with your child (ren). The discussion of rising crime in Canada since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic works to define the issue and review the Criminal Code of Canada. Saffron will discuss the effects of online exploitation, different techniques for stranger and peer perpetrated exploitation. The presentation will conclude with some tips for intervention and a practice scenario to work through as a group. Videos on the effects of social media, approaching the conversation about pornography, and the online sexual exploitation process will be shown.

Topics Covered: safe screen time tips, safety tips for different platforms (YouTube and Google), social media safety tips and terms and conditions (TikTok, Instagram, Snapchat), online gaming safety tips, Discord, live streaming, pornography, sexting, communication, helpful tools, online child sexual exploitation and its forms [content warning provided], online grooming techniques, peer sexual exploitation, signs of online child sexual exploitation, tips for intervention.
