Program Overview

NorQuest College is licensed to deliver the Health Care Aide Government of Alberta Provincial Curriculum.

Career Potential

Upon successful completion of the program, you will be prepared to work in continuing care institutions, home care agencies, group homes, assisted or supportive living facilities, day programs, specialized care centres and programs, acute care hospitals, and private care.

Admission Requirements

Language Arts – this requirement can be met with any of the following, or an equivalent course: 60% in English Language Arts 20-2 or equivalent. Accuplacer exam can be written and passed to meet this requirement and is part of the application fee.

Please see additional practicum requirements, which include a clear PIC, immunizations, N95 Mask fit test, Basic Life Support (BLS) / CPR, other courses offered through NorQuest.

Health Care Aide workplace education delivery applicants only:

Must meet all program admission requirements listed above and must be currently employed as a front-line caregiver in a participating continuing care agency.

English Language Proficiency (ELP) Requirements

If English is your second language, you must provide proof of English language proficiency before admission. These results must be no more than two years old when you start your program.
